# A Message From Mr Pope

Dear Parents and carers,

We are having a fantastic 'Break the Rules Day' and I would like to thank the PTFA for such a wonderful idea. It is also an opportunity for this week's curriculum focus to be on our approach to personal development. Our PSHE curriculum is an important driver for this and ensures we meet the National curriculum. To go over and above this we also regularly adapt to meet the needs of children as they come up. We also ensure we have our star qualities that permeate everything we do. In our school the children's behaviour is a credit to us and to you. The children we serve are fantastic and we are so proud of them. For all children, they will occasionally make mistakes and (sometimes inadvertently) break the rules. We have already discussed the this in relation to one of our British values – The Rule of Law and the story of Rosa Parks. Today we will be speaking about that again in assembly but in a slightly different way, about how it is ok to make mistakes – it is our reaction to it and the actions we take after that that are important. Part of our teaching of personal development is related to having a growth mindset and being positive. We use the analogy of the Learning Pit and 'The Power of Yet' to teach the children about these things in a simple and meaningful way.

It enabled the school to attend a number of strategic delivery sessions including how SEND data is used in strategic planning and 'Leading a Neurodiverse classroom'. The conference also provided a number of opportunities for collaboration with colleagues across Devon and improved our outward facing approach to delivering a high quality provision for pupils in our school








# Whole School

Children will learn about the importance of sustainability and the impact walking to school can have on the planet.




#### THE MAGIC OF MOVEMENT

Children learn how walking or wheeling is a great way to clear our heads and boost morale, arriving to school happy and ready to learn.


