
A Message From The PTFA

How to Apply for a Primary School Place in Devon

You can apply online at

from 15th November 2022 to the 15th January 2023

Even if you have already given details to a primary school, you must apply for a place through the Admissions Team. This is the only way to apply; other forms or lists held by schools will not count.



Primary School Applications

You will be aware that children born between 01/09/2018 and 31/08/2019 are entitled to start full time Primary Education in September 2023. The application facility opens on **15th November 2022 and closes at midnight on 15th January 2023**. It is important that parents apply before the closing date, even if they are intending to defer their child's application until later in the academic year, they must secure a place before that decision needs to be made. Devon Annual Consultation On School Admissions 2024/25

Devon's annual consultation on School Admissions Arrangements 2024/25 is now running and will close on **Friday 6th January 2023**. Responses must be submitted either by email to schoolsadmissionpolicy-mailbox@devon.gov.uk or in writing to School Admissions and Transport Consultation, Devon County Council, Room L60, County Hall, Exeter EX2 4QG by Friday 6th January 2023. All responses will be shared with schools and considered. A report will be presented to DCC's Cabinet meeting on Friday 10th Feb 2023 for determination including the individual admission policies for community and voluntary controlled schools.


The key dates for consultation are:

Devon LA consultation ends: 6 Jan 2023; Admission arrangements to be determined: 28th Feb 2023; Admission arrangements to be published: 15th March 2023; Deadline for formal objections to the School Adjudicator: 15th May 2023.

The consultation includes the co-ordinated admissions schemes for the LA, the education transport policy and relevant areas for admissions purposes. It also includes the individual school policies for all state-funded, mainstream schools within Devon and the academies in the neighbouring LA area's listed. There are proposed changes to the boundaries of many school across the county of Devon for 2024/25. Have Your Say On Our City

If so, you might be interested to learn that Exeter City Council have launched a consultation on the Exeter Plan, which will shape the future of the city through to 2040. They are keen to get the input from Exeter's residents, including young people! The Exeter Plan will be the blueprint for the evolution of the city over the next twenty years. It sets out where development should go, what it should look like and provides policies on key issues, such as health, which will be used for planning applications. Cllr Emma Morse, Lead Councillor for City Development and Planning said: "This consultation is so important and we really want everyone in Exeter to get involved. Every policy within the document-from housing to climate change, culture to employment, has the potential to affect each of us in Exeter." Parental Conflict – Information for Parents

Most of us have disagreements about things in our relationships – whether this is related to putting the washing in the basket and not on the floor! spending too much time on the phone, or what to watch on TV! Not all conflict is damaging, however if those disagreements are frequent, prolonged, not resolved and deal with and lead to continual arguing, it can all have a negative impact on children.

Indeed there is a growing body of evidence that shows Children who witness adults shouting, arguing, ignoring each other frequently or for long periods of time, can negatively impact on their self-esteem, mental and physical health, behaviour, academic achievements and relationships with others.

Conflict in relationships can occur in all types of families: between biological parents, step parents, foster and adoptive parents, parents and grandparents and separated and divorced parents to name just a few.
