Message from Mr Pope

Dear Parents/Carers,

The last two weeks in school have been very busy for the staff team and I am really grateful to them for their hard work and dedication. On the 26th and 28th of November, we have taken part in two evaluations of our core curriculum areas. Maths on the 26th November and English on the 28th with our new school advisor Julie Stevens. Julie is an experienced member of the school effectiveness team with a background as an English advisor and specialist. Both of the above activities showed real strength in our provision and some of the new undertakings that we have introduced (weekly indepth feedback sheets; retrieval practice and left hand, right hand page scaffolding approach; diving deeper questions and mastering number) were seen to be having a really positive impact on children's learning. Some of the comments made on the day and in our report were:

"Children have what they need to access learning."

"A really clear and consistent approach and strength in terms of structure, sequence and clarity of progression."

Coding club has been brilliant and the children have been amazing – some of the knowledge on display from many of the children is very impressive and a certain member of Year 6 clearly has a bright future in programmable technologies. The children have all made programmable buggies and in the Spring term will be our resident experts. Children across the school will have opportunity to make and code their own buggies as part of our computing enrichment.





The two weeks of Christmas are now upon us and the PTFA have been amazing, as always, preparing for the Christmas Fair. We have very high gusts of wind forecast on Saturday, which will affect all of our outdoor areas so please be careful when you are coming to the site. The event will have to take place inside the school buildings but it will still be amazing and my thanks go out to them all for organising everything.

We have the pantomime trip, performances, Christingle and singalongs all taking place in the next two weeks. There is lots of excitement in the air and we are very much looking forward to seeing all of you in school.






Money Raised Recently

Devon's annual admissions consultation is now open and will close on Friday 10 January 2025. It will be of interest to parents of children aged 2-18.

The consultation includes the co-ordinated admissions schemes for the LA and individual school policies for all state-funded, mainstream schools within Devon and the academies in neighbouring LA areas that are listed below.

Proposed changes to school admissions policies

Responses must be submitted either by email to schoolsadmissionpolicy-mailbox@devon.gov.uk or in writing to School Admissions Consultation, Devon County Council, Room L60, County Hall, Exeter EX2 4QG by Friday 10 January 2025. They can also be sent to the schools themselves.

All responses will be shared with schools and considered.

A report will be presented to Devon County Council's Cabinet meeting on Friday 14 February 2025 for determination including the individual admission policies for community and voluntary controlled schools.

Governing Bodies and Trusts responsible for determining the policies of academies, foundation and voluntary aided schools will meet in late January or in February.
