**Message from Mr Pope** 

Dear Parents/Carers,

The first two weeks of the summer term have been very full and the children have had lots of opportunity to enrich their learning. Year 2 thoroughly enjoyed the aquarium, Years 4 and Reception have visited Seaton wetlands and we have had visitors deliver Climate Care workshops in multiple year groups. We also had an assembly and discussions centring around Hindusim with Muhunthiny who is so full of joy and enthusiasm she is a real inspiration. My thanks to her for changing her plans and even her holiday arrangements to be with us.

Extra-curricular clubs and sports have been a feature for many of the children including lego STEM club, short tennis, maypole, self-defence, dance and boardgames which starts soon. I have thoroughly enjoyed seeing so many children join the martial arts club, we hope they are enjoying it and doing something a little bit different. Well done to the children who took part in multi skills and cricket at Budleigh Salterton over the two days. I have been informed you were excellent ambassadors for our school and performed brilliantly.

A new government plan has been set out recently meaning that all schools are required to have a Climate Action Plan in place. This has been a feature of Devon School Leadership training in recent weeks and having attended this as well as listened to a recent speech delivered by John Laramy who sits on the curriculum assessment review panel I can say with confidence that our school is very much meeting and exceeding these new expectations.

Teachers and teaching assistants have also had some visitors and training recently both in executive function and precision teaching. We are grateful to the practitioners who visited us to deliver these invaluable and informative sessions that will help develop our teaching of all pupils and those with special educational needs.

Well done to our year one and year 4 children who took part in the phonics tests and multiplication tables check recently. 96% of our children passed the phonics test and we will receive the results of our tables check soon. We are very proud of our children - they always try their best!

Coming up we have our Arts week which we are combing this year with a week of learning about the Windrush Generation. This will also involve a menu change on one day and a visitor for the children in KS2 to share their experiences. We are planning a date to invite parents into school to share some of this learning in the last week and more information will follow.

Transition week is also coming up and you will be notified in the next two weeks who your child's class teacher/s will be. We are finalising these arrangements now and we appreciate your patience with this.

Reception parents meeting – thankyou to all the parents who attended. It was lovely to meet you all and see you as you prepare for your children's first day at school. We have 29 children joining us in reception next year and we are very much looking forward to seeing them. I know the children in year 4 are also raring to go and meet their new buddies.

#### <u>Lateness - I need to inform parents of some of the new procedures we are implement-</u> ing as of Monday.

Firstly, I would like to thank the vast majority of the school community for their punctuality and arrival at school. The early morning is a really important time for children in so many ways. We are now introducing some new measures in the office and procedures for lateness which I need to make you aware of. We will now be insisting that where children are late, parents come to the office where you will be asked to complete a slip giving the school the reason for the incidence of lateness. We would also remind all parents, of children under year 5, you must accompany your children to the office when they are late to sign them into school. The only dispensation we offer is where this has been agreed with the school SENDCO or a reducing lateness plan and meeting has been held and is in place (these are reviewed on a half termly basis).

On a lighter and much more positive note, the Summer fete is coming very soon on the 20th June. The Maypole club has been running and the children have been practising hard. It is such a wonderful tradition and we are grateful to Mrs Raffell and Ms Winterburn for their time. The King and Queen appointed which has been very exciting and hotly contested.
