The children have loved this week and we are really proud of the way they have applied themselves to the sports on offer and competed in the right way.

This week we have received our SATs results. The children in year 6 have done extremely well and we are very proud of them for the way they have applied themselves this year in all areas.

Our school has posted some very impressive results across the board this year. 95% of children in year 1 achieved the phonics pass mark and in every KS2 benchmark our school has outperformed both their Devon counterparts and the National Average – in some areas significantly so. I believe this is testament to the simple fact that 99% of our children are reported to feel safe and happy in the school. As a staff team, we feel this is the key to the betterment of our pupils.
