Chair's Report to the AGM – 2021

Introduction

Another challenging year for the PTFA, due to the Coronavirus pandemic and resulting lockdowns and school closure, we were sadly unable to hold our 'Big Four' fundraisers (Bonfire Night, Christmas Fair, Easter Eggstravaganza, and Summer Fete) or any of our class cake sales. We look forward to the coming year now that restrictions have been lifted, so we can continue to support the school in the 2021/22 academic year. We are, however, proud of the PTFA's fundraising over the past year, with lots of Covid-safe activitites, in line with government guidelines, that meant **the PTFA raised an amazing £7,781** for the school this year.

We managed to hold several fundraisers, including; Christmas hamper and Summer raffles, Halloween and Christmas trails, Easter and Bake-Off competitions, a sponsored walk, Christmas cards, a penny collection, a clothing collection, and a school lottery. These were organised and run by parents, teachers and children from the school. We are very grateful to all those who helped run these events, to the local businesses who supported them and to everyone who took part. In addition to these fundraisers we received £1,000 from a successful grant application.

About the PTFA
