#### PTFA Survey review

Georgia created a survey of the PTFA on google forms. As a PTFA we wanted to get an idea what worked well and what we need to change in order to keep the PTFA work efficiently and provide what the school community wants. The results will be attached to the minutes if you would like to view them.

Janine very kindly summarised the main points:

- autonomy - sounds like there are people who do want to get involved but don't feel empowered or perhaps trusted to take forward initiatives, so perhaps thinking about how we can approach this going forward so that more people are involved and it's not always the same amazing supporters. Can we really 'walk through' the experience/journey of a parent/new parent and the PTFA? Look at what works well and if we respond to some of the barriers noted in the feedback?

- appreciation - taking the time for a more 'personal' approach to thanking people. Not necessarily individually but engaging at the events with helpers or afterwards in WhatsApp groups or emails.

- visibility of raised money - really showing, on a regular basis, how much we raise and what the money is spent on. This will help to build the link between the funding activity and the purchase.

- getting pupils involved - I saw a couple comments around getting pupils involved. I think this is lovely - bring their own ideas, give them accountability and a part of their school.

- less frequent but well informed communication. I'm possibly slightly bias in that I am the same. The WhatsApp messages are intense! Can we agree a regular pattern of comms? Ie 1 month via email have a bulletin. Then just one message the day or week before the cake sale.

- how we communicate - looks like some prefer email and WhatsApp. Having the same message multiple times is overwhelming and people switch off when there may well be something key in the latest addition! As above, can we have a 'purpose' to the regular email comms and really limit the WhatsApp's?

- meetings - looks like there might be a need for two times for meetings, worth trialling.

The PTFA had a great discussion about different things that we think could introduce suggestions included: fruit offered at cake sales too, growing a £1 initiative, children running stalls at the fairs, easyfundraising, baking contests.

## Meeting with Mr Pope

Georgia and Teri had a meeting with Mr Pope today, we went through the schools wish list and what the PTFA might be able to fundraise for. We have agreed that this year we are going to do a massive push for a trim trail for KS1 on the bottom field and climbing frame/equipment for KS2 on the top field

There will be an announcement coming from school to all parents, but we thought we'd give you guys the heads up. The next step is to get some quotes and set a fundraising target, and let everyone know that we're on a mission! ③

Georgia wanted to follow up on the conversation yesterday with regards to growing a £1. Like I said Mr Pope really likes the enterprise idea and linking it to maths week in November. However, he was much more keen than rather it being individual and something that is done at home (worries about that it will be parent led, some children won't be able to be supported even if they are enthusiastic to participate) therefore has proposed the idea that each class is given a sum of money and see what they can create as a class? Possibly make a business plan, work out costs, profits etc. Also introducing this in November means that potentially pupils can sell at the Christmas fair. Also it can be become a bit of a competition between classes?

Generally, most of the group agreed this would be a good compromise, however some reservations about the pressure on parents, possibly try to include banks/businesses to support the idea, possibly not an individual idea anymore.

# Meeting with the School Council

Georgia had a lovely meeting with the school council today, where they shared some of their ideas—though I had to remind them a few times that certain things would be Mr. Pope's responsibility!

Here are some of their main suggestions:

- More goals and footballs for the playground.
- Organize a fair where children can sell their handmade items, with the profits going to the PTFA.
- Create a sheltered area in the KS2 playground.
- Host a sponsored football tournament to raise funds.
- Offer a class reward of a day trip to Adventure Island for raising the most money.
- Install monkey bars in the playground.
- Provide more indoor activities for wet play days.
- Invite interesting visitors to teach them about various topics.

#### **School Calendars**

Kelly Rogers was talking to a friend and she mentioned that her school's PTFA sells a calendar each year (like a physical printed calendar to hang on the wall) that includes all the key PTFA events and term/school dates for the year ahead. It also has a self-portrait of each child on the month of their birthday (cute!), and they sell advertising space to local businesses. Calendars are sold to parents for £6 each. Adverts are sold to businesses for £50 each.

Information gathered so far...

- Only one size (A3) every child in reception gets one for free
- Rest of school pay £6 per calendar
- Ads £50 each and businesses who advertise get a free copy
- Reception kids draw their portraits when they come in for settle days ahead of the summer hols
- Academic year.

- Pics are arranged so each month shows all the kids in school whose birthdays are that month. (The yellow star is because Wren wasn't there when they did their pictures.)

- Year 6 draw all the teachers and governors after finishing SATS

A quote from my friend "EVERYONE buys it because it's like 'The Bible' for the year and has everything on it. Grandparents buy them too."

A group has been formed to create the calendars that the PTFA group are very excited about!
