General slips, trips, falls and minor injuries.	All attendees at risk of trips and falls	Identified areas of risk. Attendees of the trail will be responsible for their own groups as they are individually led activity. There will be a map and directions to follow. Explain to all attendees if they cross fields with livestock they cross calmly and quietly, keeping the group together. Be prepared to divert around livestock if necessary. Follow the Countryside Code (England & Wales) and Access Code (Scotland). Leave gates and property as you find them. Check paths are suitable for a group to use safely and make changes if necessary. Follow any local warnings or signs, and advise walkers to keep away from the edge.	Check for muddy/slippery sections on the recce and adapt the route if necessary. Advise walkers to bring suitable footwear for the conditions. Teri's contact detail will be available to attendees to the trail in case of an emergency.	Teri/Georgia
