Teri further stated that's she would not be able to organise the busy schedule of events and fundraisers that fill the school calendar without the incredible team that she says she is so lucky to have. The committee; Georgia, Henry, Jon, and (retired committee member) Kate, have worked tirelessly behind the scenes and Teri wanted to share her thanks as well as to the extended to the larger PTFA team and Class Reps who contribute to planning, organising, idea brainstorming, troubleshooting, making, baking, buying, wrapping, promoting, recruiting, raffle prize gathering and manning stalls. Teri expressed her delight to work with Newton Poppleford & Harpford Parish Council again at the village bonfire night event. Many thanks to Sian Pond for organising a great fun Tropic Party in aid of the PTFA. Acknowledgment to Jody Hall's hard work in coordinating the Christmas Card artwork in school. Thank you to Gordon Legg of East Devon Ices for organising Ice Cream Friday. Thank you to Camille Harman and Anna Oldroyd for running the uniform shop. Huge thanks to those who have kindly donated their school lottery winnings to the PTFA, we have received four donations from winners this year. And thank you to all the class reps for organising their class bake sales. Sadly, our clothing bank has been removed by the company who supplied it, due to a reduction on their routes, we are hoping to replace it soon. Unfortunately, Amazon Smile has ceased to operate this year, so we will no longer receive income from this source. Teri would also like to say thank you to the school community for supporting the events throughout the year.

Treasurers report

Jon shared the PTFA Current Account opening balance for 2022/23 was £20,545.05 which was the result of great fundraising year in 2021/22 for which the PTFA committee are extremely grateful to all involved. At the end of the 2022/23 year the Current Account stands at £24,739.03. This results in total End-of-Year funds on 31st August 2023 of £24,739.03. Of this balance £9,700 is ringfenced for use in the Outdoor Space projects leaving a total of £15,039.03 available for use by the school. Seeing a balance increase is always encouraging, but to give an idea of the work involved, this year the PTFA Inbound Cashflow was a total of £11,558.13 with outgoings of £4,768.54 in the form of expenses, resulting in an annual fund increase of £4,193.98, but more importantly, investing £5,851.73 in equipment for the school and trips, workshops and experiences for the children. These are the figures that will be submitted to the Charities Commission which we are required, as a Charity, to each year. Jon explained that we had moved the PTFA bank account from HSBC as we would incur monthly fines and moved to Lloyds where we will not incur monthly

charges for treasury account. Jon explained that the PTFA always need a buffer or capital for floats or for requests but haven't fundraised yet therefore that is why we have a healthy bank balance.

Reminders will be sent out to class teachers of their current pot of cake sale money from carry over and that coach funding money is available. Jon highlighted some detail around income and donations which can be found in detail in the Treasurer's report. Jon highlighted underlying PTFA expenses:
