#### A Message From Mr Pope

Dear Parents/Carers,

The half term has got off to a fast start and we have seen some fantastic lessons and experiences across the curriculum. Year 2 brought in some really interesting and exciting toys – it was lovely for them to have a window into the other children's family experiences and they loved seeing the memories that were shared. Thank you for supporting that so brilliantly. The Lyme Regis trip for year 3 was fantastic and they found some real treasures including a Victorian pendant and an abundance of fossils and ammonites (with some fool's gold thrown in for luck). The children were very excited and eager to show off their finds and explain what they had learnt.

#### A focus on maths fluency:

After the success of our recent maths problems solving, we have a new instalment that you should have received today. There are three problems for the different age groups in the school and we are very interested in seeing some more exciting entries. We are also holding a TT Rockstars battle for the next two weeks that has started today. The years 3 and 4 will be facing off against each other as will the years 5 and 6.

In maths, we focus on teaching pupils their number facts and times tables and to be fluent in their mental strategies. This focus is always on understanding the underlying structures and building a deep conceptual understanding. This leads them to 'automaticity'- the automatic retrieval of basic maths facts. We think this is vitally important as automaticity enables children to work on more complex problems more easily. By doing additional practice at home in these facts, you can help us consolidate this understanding for your child by giving the children lots of practice. TT Rockstars is a really fun and engaging way to achieve this. There are also tools for younger children such as the White Rose one-minute maths app. If you want to see it and try it out with your child, just follow the link below and use the three words net-bob-bug to gain access to a web version (look out for the hint button if your child needs support. <a href="https://whiteroseeducation.com/digital-tools">https://whiteroseeducation.com/digital-tools</a>

Although we have had a blip with the reading shed, we are well on the way to re-organising the books and restoring things. Please bear with us and thank you for your patience. As we look ahead to the next few weeks, we are very excited to be holding World Book Day on the 7<sup>th</sup> March. As a school, we will also be using that week as our storytelling week and the children will engage in lots of sharing of stories with each other.

We have also recently hosted some more visitors to our school to ensure we continue our focus on improving the provision for our children. We continually strive for a culture of success that relies upon a cycle of improvement, reflection and refinement of practice. These visits have highlighted some key strengths such as in phonics where: 'teacher expectations at key milestones are now higher'. Or in history and geography where: 'effective, well-structured teaching in both subjects was observed across the school' My thanks go out to the staff team for their efforts in developing our teaching and learning at Newton Poppleford.

#### School Uniform—a polite request

**Uniform on PE days and trainers on other days** – please can I ask that all parents ensure children wear appropriate uniform. All children are expected to wear their school jumper on PE days (a personal sports hoodie or tracksuit is not part of our uniform policy). When children do not have PE or forest school, they are also expected to be in black school shoes. Children must not wear coloured trainers on days when they are expected to wear uniform. We feel we have a good balance with our uniform policy of supporting pupil well-being but we also ask that the school's uniform expectations are met.


