Message from Mr Pope

Dear Parents and carers,

Firstly, Happy New Year to everyone in our school community. As the days are beginning to get longer and we have had a bit of sunshine, it has felt a very bright start to our school term. The children have come back in a very positive way and their attitudes and commitment to learning have been brilliant.

Over the past two weeks our enrichment activities have begun with some interesting and engaging visits for many of the children. We started our term with a fantastic educational experience all about Hinduism; Jays Aim provided a session of CPR and how to use a defibrillator and we were lucky enough to have a visit from Tomas Williams the Senior Education and Engagement Officer for UK parliament who held an assembly for all the children. In fact, first aid has been a bit of a theme as many staff members have also had Paedeatric First Aid and Emergency First Aid training to ensure that as a school we more than meet our requirements by a significant margin. We also had a Health and safety review on Wednesday which we passed with flying colours. I am very grateful to our office and admin team for all their hard work. A special mention to Mrs Nash who is so competent and works tirelessly behind the scenes. She is an incredible asset to our school community and is worthy or much praise and gratitude for her efforts for the children and staff here.

The PTFA fundraising for our play equipment is now ramping up – we have had visitors to the school providing us with quotes for this equipment and although an ambitious target for us to hit we are excited about what we might be able to achieve for the children. Next week is 'Break the Rules Day' so watch this space for more details.

We continue to look at developing oracy as our school improvement focus across the year and all classrooms are now using Talk Tactics in their daily teaching and learning to elevate the quality of talk in the classrooms. This term we will be explicitly teaching the children how to speak and present as well as the introduction and use of higher-level vocabulary in the classroom.

This term we are looking at providing more opportunities for you to come in and share some learning opportunities with the children. We will be timetabling 'rock up and read' slots with each class as well as some maths sessions. Currently, we envisage these being 15 minute sessions at the start or end of the school day to enable more parents to attend. We are also planning on having a fun run in the last week of term on the afternoon of Monday the 10th February. This is weather dependent and more details will follow but if you would like to join and run with us please feel free to come along.
