Learning hook	Children to assess propaganda material from WW2 and become censors and fake detectors.

Creative outcome	Children will design their own WW2 propaganda posters.

Play Project	Creation of stretchers and shelters in Adventure Island to act out WW2 scenes.
Celebration	We will display our Propaganda posters to celebrate our understanding of WW2.

'Rose Blanche' Ian McEwan



Rose Blanche was the name of a group of young German citizens who, at their peril, protested against the war.
