Funding applications

Henry highlighted a 'Green Space Funding' for East Devon communities. This will be looked into to see if Newton Poppleford School could benefit from this.

Reading Raffle

The PTFA have been approached by Kirsty Singfield (Lead English Teacher) about funding a runner up prize for the Reading Raffle. The Committee have agreed this request and will buy a £5 voucher from Winstones.

Book Fair

The PTFA took £570 from the book fair which is fantastic and will mean we get 40% to spend on books which is £228. However, if we spend £30 of the PTFA funds on some of the books then we would have book fair sales of £600 which would mean that Schoolatic would give us 50% to spend on books and therefore the school would have £300 rather than £228. Therefore, the PTFA have agreed to invest £30 on books to give the school a total of £300 to spend.

Summer Fete

The Summer Fete normally commences a couple of weeks before the end of term, so would have been the 7th July. We moved it to June because of the provisional circus date. As the circus looks increasingly likely to be pushed to 2024, we could now move it back to the 7th July slot. Extra week for planning and extra week for them to practice the maypole. The Committee have agreed that the 7th July is a better date for the Summer Fete. It will also remain on the Friday night to try and keep a captive audience afterschool. Henry has also created the QR codes and ordered the raffle tickets.

Circus

Teri's investigations with the Rugby Club and EDDC were going well however it hasn't materialised to anything therefore as it's less than two months away Teri has suggested that we push it to 2024 when we will have more time to prepare.
