The children have also been linking their work to Refugee Week and have studied artists who were refugees under the wider theme. A huge thankyou to Mrs Turner for organising and Steve McCracken who has really inspired our children. one of the best moments of the week was the impromptu audience that surrounded him and watched with great curiosity and delight as he was preparing the landscape for our mural at lunchtime. Thankyou also to the parents that helped deliver watercolour and printing sessions for the pupils. They were really appreciated and helped the children immensely.

Last week some of our statutory assessments took place including phonics and the multiplication tables check. Well done to all the children who were part of this and applied themselves so well. We have had some fantastic artists in throughout the week to work with the children. A huge thank you to Penny Silverthorne who did a watercolour workshop and Amy Sweet who did a printing workshop with different classes. Steve McCracken, a local street artist, came in to spend 2 days with the children painting local wildlife and all of the children's artwork will appear as part of a mural or in different locations around the school. He was a great inspiration to all and it was fantastic to work with the artist whose work we see on so many streets around Sidmouth and Exeter. A super Thursday afternoon saw a fantastic exhibition put together with all of the children's artwork and a chance to spend time with children and adults enjoying a picnic in the sun creating art. A big thank you to all of the children for embracing and expressing their creativity during the week.

Reception had the most wonderful day on a 'Pirate Adventure' at Seaton Wetlands. They went on a treasure hunt, had to cross the crocodile swamp, were blindfolded in the woods and had to hold onto a rope, walked the plank and made boats and then floated them down the stream!"

Year 3—Art Week—All about Animals and our local area











This week was also art week in year 3. We focussed on our local area and started the week by looking carefully at pictures of animals from our local area. We studied the shapes of their bodies in detail and then made them in clay. Working with Steve McCracken, we were then able to explore these animals even more by focussing in their colours. We experimented with mixing paints to get the different shades of green, brown and grey we wanted for our animals.

This week we also studied the work of Frank Auerbach, a Jewish artist who fled Germany in 1939, when he was just 8 years old and grew up in Kent, which was being broken down and built up again during and after the war. He was an impressionist who focussed on the different colours and he used lots of layers of paint. We looked at his paintings, focussing on his landscapes. We sketched the landscape surrounding our school and focussed on the different colours and how they made us feel. We made our own impression-ist landscapes, using lots of layers of paint, just like Frank Auerbach. We felt really inspired!

Choir is going from strength to strength, as a number of new children have joined recently, which is fantastic. Beth McLean, our choir leader, has created a wonderful 'Summer Medley' for the children to sing, along with 'Mama Mia'. Unfortunately, Sidmouth College have had to cancel their summer concert.
