


Message from Mr Pope


Dear Parents and Carers,

In this week's newsletter I would like to celebrate the children's maths work and achievements over this term. In each year group, the children have really excelled in so many different ways. In each lesson children have an aspect of fluency, reasoning and problem solving. As part of our oracy framework, we place the value on mathematical thinking and children's explanations of how they know. Children increasingly become more adept at explaining, justifying, generalising and proving they are correct. Below are some examples form our current curriculum of children applying themselves to problems in years 1, 3 and 6. Parents can really support learning in maths at home in a number of ways. "We will miss you and you are always welcome to come and visit.


