A Message From Mr Pope

Dear Parents/Carers,

Many of you will have seen on Facebook that we had a lovely surprise to start this Summer term with a letter from David Attenborough to our Year 1 class. He is a figure we look at in our curriculum so it was lovely to receive a message back for the children. We have also welcomed Mrs Bradley back to the school after her brief absence and all the children and adults are very pleased to have her back with us.

Across the summer term we have some exciting things for the school. There are various trips, events and dates for the diary as well as some that are pending confirmation. Two of note are our Sports week (Sports Day will take place in this week) and Art week in the second part of the summer term. Art week will also give parents an opportunity to come in and see the work the children have created with a gallery event. At the start of the year we voted on our pupil priorities, the children voted emphatically to work with an artist to create a mural that raises awareness of climate change and this will be a key part of that week. The other priorities are also ongoing and you can see them below:

- 1: Improve the school's approach to environmental issues by joining the WAR on WASTE initiative and help us to achieve the eco flag award.
- 2: Develop our approach to helping everyone in school with their well-being. This includes diversity and anti-bullying initiatives. We want to make sure we have fun, our learning is healthy and active and we spend time in the outdoors. (We will be working towards achieving awards for this as well).
- 3: To raise money for an art mural that raises awareness of climate change that all pupils contribute to.

An insight into our school development activity: Each term the teaching staff engage in action research not only to improve our own professional practice as a team but also to improve the outcomes for pupils. These action research cycles are based on current evidence from educational research as well as what we believe will improve our school.

In Autumn we looked at feedback and its impact on pupil progression. "Feedback functions formatively only if the information fed back to the learner is used by the learner in improving performance." - Dylan Williams

In Spring we looked at memory and how can we help children to learn more, remember more and do more "Using our memory shapes our memory." - Robert Bjork. The idea of desirable difficulty – is it supposed to be easy?

In Summer we are looking at how we question children and the importance of wait time and preparation time for pupils. Does giving wait time and focusing on higher order questioning provide a richer learning experience for pupils within the classroom? Cohen et al. (Cohen et al., 2004)

I feel it is important for you as parents to know that as a staff team we are constantly working to better our practice together – this is part of our culture that develops the opportunities for children within our school and is very much driven by our school vision.

Thank you to everyone who took part in the activities over Easter, we have received some lovely art work and stories. I will be looking at these next week with the pupil leaders and celebrating them in assembly today. We will also be publishing some of them in the next issue of the Hive.

On the 30th April Mrs Tollerfield will be leaving us and I once again want to thank her for her contribution to our school and wish her well on her next steps. Mrs Laureys and Mrs Tollerfield are working very closely together over the next few weeks to ensure a robust handover. As mentioned before, we will be in touch very shortly to arrange dates with parents of children with SEND to meet with Mrs Laureys to discuss their child or children.

We are going to be creating a community garden from some of our allotments that we would like to offer out to the public after school on a Thursday. We are going to be running this between 3:30pm and 4:30pm on a Thursday after school. More details will follow but if you know of anyone or if you would like to be involved in this please do let us know. We hope everyone is looking forward to a fantastic summer term ahead!

This week we had a very encouraging visit form Hannah Jones the new SEND area advisor for East Devon. We spoke about the possibilities of collaboration and Hannah has offered to join meetings with our Learning Community schools for greater consistency across the area. SEND continues to be the primary area of focus for the local authority as they are working with the DfE to reduce the huge deficit by engaging in something called the safety valve agreement. This was a very positive visit and Hannah will be working closely with maintained schools to support their offering. She has also offered advice and support for Mrs Laureys as she moves into her new role.

Last half term, our play leaders helped organise and lead a day of PE for the whole school. They came up with five different stations for each class to participate in throughout the day. The whole school had a great time!












In year 6, this half term, we will be looking at the use of colour. On Tuesday, we looked at a few different artists and explored creating art using their style of colour!
