Easter Walk

Laura has suggested the idea of a Easter walk that she is willing to organise. Laura's idea is to do a sponsored walk over Hunger Hill. It will encourage to get the children outside and be in nature. Laura suggested we call it the Easter Hop and the children could choose the 1 or 5 km walk or even 10km if they wanted to challenge themselves. Laura suggested that we could paint some bunnies and have them on the common and have a little water station. Laura has suggested that this take place over the Easter holidays. Laura has suggested a separate meeting for the walk. (please see minute meetings for the Easter Hop)

Teri has asked for volunteers to share posters around the local area.

Easter

Rebecca and Janine have requested that we have plans submitted earlier so they can have an input on ideas and have a date for the Easter Egg Hunt.

It was agreed at the AGM that we wouldn't do an Easter Fair this year, it was pointed out that two fairs (Christmas and Summer) was enough and we had got better engagement/volunteers for events if we stopped forcing people to attend so many. Historically Easter has always been a struggle to staff so Teri was onboard with the idea. At the AGM we did agree that we would do the two big Easter fundraisers/the good bits: the Easter Egg Hunt and the Rainbow Raffle.

Teri proposes that this is afterschool in the playground, perhaps the last day of term.

Rainbow raffle- Teri will put and appeal for colour themed donations, needs to be voted whether tickets are sold in advance or on the day. Pros- sell more in advance rather than on the day. Cons- the premade raffle tickets cost far more and eat into profits and we would need to pay an extra £20 for express delivery.

Last year the Rainbow Raffle made under £300 whereas the Summer Fete Raffle makes £2-3000 this is probably due to the quality of the prizes as well as selling in advance. The PTFA have probably left it too late for the Rainbow Raffle this year, with required fat delivery fee will run risk of spending all our profits if we don't sell loads in advance. We

are also asking people to buy into the Easter Egg Hunt on the same day as well as the trail over the holidays and this may impact sales too. The majority have voted for selling Rainbow Raffle tickets on the day. A shout out for 16 large boxes for the raffle and for help wrapping on Thursday 28th March after drop off. Teri has also asked for volunteers for Thursday activities:

9am: need hamper makers to meet in school and help put together the hampers.

2:30pm: Need help setting up the hunts and moving the raffle to the playground

3pm: Need help running the hunt and selling the raffle tickets.

Easter Egg Hunt-The PTFA needs to set up two age appropriate Easter egg hunts in the playground. We have some resources from last year that we can use again. It was decided Tesco was the cheapest place to purchase the Easter Eggs £1.20 from Tesco using a clubcard. Also, Tesco have very kindly donated £15 voucher towards the Easter Eggs.

As the weather forecast isn't looking great the decision has been made to relocate to the school hall instead of the playground.

Thank you so much for everyone who came along or supported the PTFA Tropic Party. Well done to everyone that helped to organise and run the event and thank you for all the lovely donated prizes. This event raised a fantastic £235 for the PTFA. Huge thank you to Sian and Carly too.

Disco

Sorry for the delay there has been a debate in PTFA headquarters about expenses (and whether they should ben claimed or we can accept the donation) But can now announce the disco made £345. This is obviously incredible amount for a disco! Teri thinks that this will be a one off, there was approximately £80 unclaimed expenses (tuck shop stock and disco fees that we have been donated, so on a future event these may have to come out of the profits. But even if expenses were claimed then it would still have made a staggering £260! Great work team and the PTFA will do another one around May half term.
